

June 9, 2014- West Wyoming Council Meeting

The meeting of West Wyoming Borough Council was called to order by Chairwoman Skok. Following the Pledge of Allegiance Skok asked for a moment of silence for John Bolin school board member and volunteer fireman of Wyoming who passed away this week. Roll call was taken by Cipriani and the following were present: Stavish, Cipriani, Skok, Dolan, Stevens, Grescavage, Mayor Herbert absent, Solicitor Lukesh, Jr. Councilperson Przybyla absent, Jr Councilperson Trottini absent, Treasurer DeSanto absent, Engineer Amato absent, and Secretary Zaboski, present but late.

Skok asked for a motion by Stavish, seconded by Stevens, to approve the minutes from last month's meeting. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes.

CEO's Food 4 Kids program will provide free lunches this summer at Charney Park at 12:00pm Monday through Friday starting June 23rd.

Gary Stavish- Vice Chair- Personnel & Recreation: Motion by Stavish to pay Tony Kowalczyk \$15/hour for street sweeping, seconded by Cipriani. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes. The rest is routine business and also stated that Recreation Board will be meeting Tuesday at 7:00 at the Boro Building and the public is invited.

Eileen Cipriani- Administration and Finance: Due to the absence of Treasurer DeSanto, the Treasurer's Report will not be read.

Motion by Cipriani, seconded by Grescavage, to approve all outstanding bills by the Finance Committee. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes.

Motion by Cipriani, seconded by Stavish, to pay Don E. Bower \$24,600.23 for WST project. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes.

Motion by Cipriani, seconded by Stevens, to place the amended Canvassing/Solicitation Ordinance on the table for 30 days. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes.

Motion by Cipriani to pay Krasavage \$ 9980 for street repairs, seconded by Stavish. Voice vote all in favor. Motion passes.

Dan Grescavage- Community Development- Motion by Grescavage to pass the UCC agreement with Kingston, seconded by Cipriani. Motion passes.

Grescavage stated that on Tuesday, June 24th, there will be an inspection of the Catch Basin and Concrete Channel by the Army Corp of Engineers at 1:30PM. Any Council member or Jr council wanting to come should be at the Boro building at 1:00PM. Boro workers will be working inside the basin and channel repairing seams and cracks. No one is allowed to work inside only the Borough workers. With the exception of Boro workers, the catch basin and concrete channel is off limits. Grescavage said he will be making phone calls the night before the inspection to residents to open gates.

Mike Dolan- Public Safety/Code Enforcement: The West Wyoming Fire department responded to four alarms in May: one brush fire- one brush fire with exposure- one hazardous material incident- One engine company assist. The Fire Police unit responded to four alarms for a total of 4.6 man-hours. As always , the department is looking for new members. Help is needed for active firefighters , fire police, and support personnel. Anyone interested can contact any member or call 693-3660 for more information. West Wyoming police call report – a total of 113 responses- general and agency assists, EMS were 8, fire department assists were 2, other police dept. were 33 and other agencies 4.

Walter Stevens- Public Facilities- June 14 will be the electronic recycling at the Hanover Jr. Sr. High School. Time starts at 12 noon. A reminder that no businesses are allowed to dump at the compost pile, If anyone sees this please report it. Try and keep our recycling area clean, if it gets too full please let us know. We have the front end loader outside, it is part of the grant together with Jackson Township.

Solicitor Lukesh – no report.

Councilwoman Skok reported in the place of Mayor Herbert that on Arbor Day on June 2,2014 a tree was planted in Dailey Park in the memory of Late Councilman Daniel Gadowski.
